Our new Bishops

The Episcopal Ordination of Bishops-Elect Mgr Timothy and Canon Richard will take place at St Chad's Cathedral on Tuesday 16 July at 12noon.

All are welcome to join the Mass of Ordination live streamed from St Chad's Cathedral

Earlier this year Pope Francis appointed Mgr Timothy Menezes, Dean of St Chad's Cathedral, and Canon Richard Walker, Vicar General, to be new Auxiliary Bishops to serve our Archdiocese.

Due to limitations on space the Mass of Ordination is by invitation only, but all are welcome to join online via the cathedral's live stream facility. The booklet for the Ordination will be available on the website and it is hoped it will also be recorded.

Invitations have already been issued and unfortunately it is not possible to give out any other invitations on request.

The Archbishops and Cathedral authorities kindly ask people do not turn up on the day as sadly there will be no space to accommodate extra visitors.

An Invitation to the Diocesan Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes



Hednesford on Sunday 7 July 2024

The Lourdes pastoral theme this year completes the three linked themes from Our Lady's instruction to Bernadette to *go tell the priests* (2022), *to build a chapel here* (2023) and now finally in 2024, *to come here in procession.*

The significance of the theme increases when we realise that *procession* in this context, means also a *pilgrimage*: "If Bernadette had not been Bernadette, Lourdes would not have become the meeting point of the Christian world.

"Because of this young, despised girl, an enormous flow of people started moving and hasn't stopped coming from all around the world ever since." Bishop Pierre-Marie Théas, Bishop of Tarbes and Lourdes (from 1947 to 1970)

The time of pilgrimage is completely different from the habitual Christian life. For some people it represents a particularly significant period of time. For the others, it will be a starting point, a moment of beginning again or a moment of coming back. For some other people, a pilgrimage means a full discovery of the Church, of the Gospels and of Jesus Christ. The profound commitment of Bernadette inspires us to deepen our own Christian faith.

From the very beginnings of the Shrine in Lourdes, Our Lady's message of Penance, Healing and Wholeness have spread throughout the world and we thank God for the vision of Fathers Boyle and Healey whose vision led to the building of the Church and Shrine in Hednesford at the beginning of the twentieth century.

May the prayers of Our Lady of Lourdes bring us closer to her Son and the healing and wholeness which God wants for all of us.

Notes for Saturday & Sunday Readers

Please check that what you are reading matches with the Mass Sheets. Also check if the Psalm and Gospel acclamation are being sung.

When there are two readers, one reads the First Reading and Psalm. The other reads Second Reading, Gospel Acclamation and, if there is no Deacon, the Bidding Prayers. The second reader should also introduce the **Communion Antiphon**, which follows the bell, which immediately follows the priest's communion.

Each time, the two readers should swap roles, but can arrange otherwise. If there is only one reader - please read everything!

If you are reading the Bidding Prayers please approach the lectern **before** the end of the Creed, so that you are already in place before the priest begins the Prayers, and **stay** at the lectern until the priest has concluded them.

When it is Family (School) Mass, Readers' rota may change.

Notes for Ministers of the Eucharist

At each mass, one minister assists the priest, deacon or sister. If the minister on the rota is not present, please be ready to come forward to assist.

Please approach the altar after the peace and during the "Lamb of God". Purify hands with water if provided. (and sanitise). The priest or deacon will give you communion and the paten (plate/dish) with the sacrament. Stand at one side of the altar as appropriate (priest usually in the middle). Return the paten to the altar after communion.

Notes for Stewards

Welcome people to church - assist as necessary, including with sanitiser and masks if requested. Please hand out Newsletters and Sheets, please collect in mass sheets at end for the following day (people may take them home if they want to).

Please use the bags to invite a collection before and after each mass. Please indicate to visitors the position of the Digital Collection Plate (card machine) as they enter the Church, and assist them if necessary.

Please ensure security of bags and return them to the sacristy at the end of mass.
